

Career Launch Community Engagement Rotation (CER) Director Faculty Position Description

Overview: The Bridges curriculum is designed to educate medical students who will improve the health of individuals and communities. An important component of students developing their understanding of how to improve the health of individuals and communities is direct engagement with community populations and reflection upon those experiences. The Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) supports the use of *service learning* allowing students to not only serve in the community but also to learn from those experiences. Many schools have designed community-based education experiences to teach medical students; but few have been designed to have an accompanying curriculum with reciprocal learning with community members or with health care community leaders. This new Career Launch rotation will be a required 4-week clinical experience combined with a ½ day curriculum that will allow students, faculty, community members and community health care leaders to learn from each other while promoting the education of students and improving the health of the community.

Reporting and Effort: 20% annual FTE release time beginning in late fall 2018 or early 2019. The Community Preceptor reports to the Director of Foundations 2/Career Launch and the Associate Dean for Curriculum.

Position: The successful candidate will be responsible for the development, implementation, and ongoing management of the Tier II curriculum. Students will experience the following in this curriculum:

- Caring for patients in the community setting
- Caring for patients and populations through inter-professional teams and learning teamwork, inter-professional collaboration and care for individuals and populations.
- Learning competencies of community engagement
- Learning selected skills while working within a community setting.
- Experiencing a robust and relevant community health care curriculum

Specific duties will include:

The successful candidate will work with Bridges Curriculum Career Launch faculty and staff leadership, and department education representatives to:

1. Identify and create a wide range of CER offerings that will be available starting April 2019.
2. Have direct oversight of all CER site directors
3. Work with the UCSF Center for Community Engagement
4. Develop a CER curriculum and plan sessions that will be delivered at regular intervals over the CL phase.
5. Recruit faculty to participate in the curriculum

Qualifications: Ideal candidate will have experience in and/or commitment to respectful community engagement and ambulatory care.
